Jann Otvos

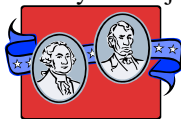

## PROGRAMS

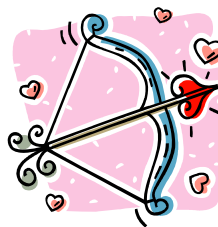

The February 1<sup>st</sup> deadline was to be able to order the coffee pots for those who wanted them. If you wish to still sign up after Feb. 1, it will be your responsibility to order your own coffee pot or bring a surface of your choice. Either pattern Rosemary West is teaching can easily be adapted to other surfaces.

The minutes from our NCCC meeting held on January 31, 2008, can be found on the NCCC website, [www.ncccinfo.com](http://www.ncccinfo.com). After paring down those minutes to information of most interest to Toll Bridge Toler, I'd like to report the following:

Individual and Chapter duties for the 2009-2010 NCCC "Season" are as follows:

Karen Vecchi has been asked (and has accepted) the responsibility for producing the NCCC Retreat Catalog. One thing different this time is that there will no longer be any printed catalogs distributed to the chapters. Instead, an electronic version will be posted on the NCCC Website. If an individual chooses to print the booklet from that location, it will be at their choice and cost to do so. To add to that already full plate, she has also agreed to again fill the role of Teacher Coordinator (whew!) with Jann and I (Barb Flavin) assisting her in any way we can.

I will again serve on the NCCC Board as Secretary.

Leah Luper will again serve as NCCC's Web Mistress.

Toll Bridge Toler as a chapter has volunteered to assist Wine Country's chapter with providing decorations for the 2010 Retreat. Jeanie Gollow is Wine Country's representative and will let us know how we can assist them. When we know what we can do to help, we'll let the Toll Bridge Toler members know so folks can volunteer if they choose to.

NCCC will not be having our next retreat at Konocti due to many factors with the major reasons being the rundown state of that facility and the difficulty in getting there. We are exploring other venue sites and will be taking a tour of three hotels located in the Sacramento area very close to freeway exits on April 4<sup>th</sup>. If none of them seem workable, we also have another possible site at Ramada's Mission de Oro Hotel in Santa Nella, which is off Highway 5 past Gustine and just before Los Banos – (another reference point is that it's near the Anderson Split Pea Restaurant). It is important to note that we are not committed to any of these sites—we're still at the investigative stage.

It was decided that due to time constraints, prior commitments for all chapters, and chapter as well as individual budget issues, we will not have a "Stay In Touch" seminar this year.

2010 Retreat Theme: After hearing many great suggestions, we finally chose a beach theme with "**Footprints in the Sand...Paintbrush in Hand**" as our slogan for the 2010 Retreat.

Our next NCCC meeting is April 4<sup>th</sup>—I'll let you know how we fare as far as Sacramento area venues go.

## PLANNING/BOARD MEETING

Jann Otvos' home, Antioch, CA

January 18, 2009

Attendees: Jann Otvos, Connie Oakley, Marianne Simpson, Jo Iaconis, Jeanie Gollow, DJ West, Liz Doran, Lisa Schall, Roz Borgerson, Tamara Mannon, Merlene Ryan

With the approval of those in attendance (since most board members were present), today's planning meeting will be held in lieu of the upcoming normally scheduled board meeting on January 20, 2008. Those unable to attend today's meeting were Darlene Smith and Karen Vecchi.

Jann began the meeting by reminding us that the Chapter rules and bylaws are posted on our website (tollbridgetolers.org). Also posted are job descriptions.

She then asked each board member if they had anything they wanted to remind us of (due dates for newsletter articles were discussed).

Jann distributed the printout showing Chapter 2009 Goals which she had created for the planning meeting, and encouraged the addition of any goals she might have missed.

#### **A. Eliminate Distractions During Programs –**

DJ added that it would be greatly appreciated if an announcement would be made prior to the start of the program asking that no clean up be started until the program is over because the noises and people movement makes it difficult for the both the teacher and those trying to paint.

Connie added that it would be helpful if the room segregated the seating so that painters are grouped near the teaching area and non-painters are away from that area.

These announcements will be made prior to the start of all projects.

#### **B. Increase Community Awareness –**

Charities: Jann asked if putting a ceiling on our charities—sponsoring two charities in the amount of \$1,000 each—would be acceptable, and money earned for our chapter beyond that would be used for members benefit. This idea was approved to bring before the membership on January 20, 2008, for an acceptance/rejection vote.

Jann suggested that we put on another Ornament Frenzy in 2009 for member benefit/education. TBT earned \$580 from the Election Board wages and \$700 from the Bunko 2008 proceeds (numbers have been rounded for general conversation purposes). TBT would pay for participating/attending members and it would include 1 surface for each member and meals. Non-members may also attend, but they would have to pay a registration fee, surface fee, etc. This cost will be determined at a later date. If a member cannot attend but would like to receive

the surfaces/instructions, it will be decided on a case-by-case basis whether the chapter will pay to ship the materials to the member or not, with consideration given to whether that member has been a productive/supportive member of the chapter in the past (i.e., donating to the chapter, performing work for the chapter, etc.). Last time, we bore the cost of packaging and shipping the materials to all members who chose not to come. It was very costly and it is felt that it was counter-productive to our goal of encouraging members to gather together to share knowledge and fellowship. Ornament Frenzy 2009 will be brought before the general membership at the upcoming meeting.

Teaching Children: Kudos to DJ for the great work she did in this effort. She agreed to continue her efforts in this area during 2009.

Community Project: We'll continue to participate in things like murals, library presentations, etc.

County / State Fair: 2008 was a record-breaking year for most submissions ever to both the County Fair and the State Fair. We'll continue to encourage even more submissions in 2009.

#### **C. Increasing Membership**

Flyers: The flyer used in 2005 would be great if updated with current information. A diskette was found by Connie with the hope that it contained that flyer.

We'll find out if our flyer can be posted in local craft stores, online agencies—such as Craig's List, Educational sites (Pleasant Hill Adult Education, Library); other possibilities are places where folks wait—i.e., DMV, BART, etc.

More Things To Do: Let's increase our fellowship to encourage our members to attend meetings and functions. Some suggestions for fun things were: Flea Market in Galt; Apple Hill visit and picnic; Folsom Gourd Festival, Gourd Festival in Knight's Landing (takes place in May); trip to Filoli in Woodlawn (Jann to investigate and report); Rosie The Riveter tour and Teddy Roosevelt Yacht tour (Roz Borgerson to investigate these), Amtrak ride from Martinez or Antioch to Old Sacramento to tour Railroad Museum (Barb Flavin will find out about this and report back).

Newspapers: In addition to our flyer, it's suggested that we notify newspapers of our meetings each month, as well as any events-of-interest. Tamara is in charge of publicity this

year, so she'll investigate these possibilities and get back to us with results.

#### **D. Provide More Painting Opportunities**

Paint-Ins (such as Ornament Frenzy); Diverse Surfaces (such as painting on gourds, fabric); More Seminars; Earlier notification of seminars sent out to other chapters (Barb will get new NCCC rep contact information to Jann and Connie and Roz so they can send TBT information to those reps for distribution to their chapter members. In addition, we'll continue to send our information to Leah for posting on the NCCC website.

#### **Budget – 2008 Actual versus 2009 Projected**

Each item was discussed with suggestions for increasing or decreasing budgeted projections—or eliminating categories.

#### **Items with increased amounts are:**

P.O. Box Rental (President & Chapter Admin) 2008 projection was \$60, actual was \$70; 2009 projection is \$80.

Handbook (President & Chapter Admin) 2008 projection was \$100, actual was \$105.81; 2009 projection is \$120.00.

Installation Dinner Program (Program – 1<sup>st</sup> VP) 2008 projection was \$500, actual was \$531.46; 2009 projection is \$550.00.

Chapter Charities (Community Enrichment) 2008 projection was \$1,500, actual was \$2,000; 2009 projection is \$2,000.00.

Bunko 2008 projection was \$3,000, actual was \$3,452.00; 2009 projection is \$3,000.

Bunko Expenses 2008 projection was \$1,500, actual was \$722.16; 2009 projection is \$1,500.00.

Teaching Fee for Ornament Frenzy (Paint-Ins) 2008 projection was zero, actual was zero; 2009 projection is estimated at \$1,500 (\$40 per attendee/37 attendees).

Ornament Frenzy Monitor (Paint-Ins) 2008 projection was zero, actual was zero; 2009 projection is \$75 for one adult monitor (\$75 rather than standard \$50 because it will be an all-day event).

#### **Items with decreased amounts OR items removed from the 2009 budget are:**

Cookbook – this item is to be removed from 2009 budget  
Cookbook Expenses – this item is to be removed

White Elephant Net - this item is to be removed

Domain Name Renewal (Webmaster) 2008 projection was \$75; actual was \$99.95; 2009 projection will be \$35 because we just renewed our domain name and it comes due every 3 years. If we project \$35 each year between now and then, it is hoped that we will have set aside adequate funds for the 2012 renewal fee.

## **GENERAL MEETING**

First Lutheran Church, Concord, CA

January 20, 2009

The meeting was called to order by President Jann Otvos at 7:30 p.m. with a quorum present. The minutes and Treasurer's report were approved as published in the December 2008, and January 2009, newsletters (Barbara Bouchet/Liz Little).

Correspondence: The County Election Board sent a letter of thanks for Chapter members working at the November election. \$580 was earned. Jann thanked Merlene Ryan, Roz Borgerson, Virginia Davison, Connie Oakley, Barbara Flavin, Barbara Bouchet, Rose Marie Roza and Shirley Irwin for their efforts. The Monument Crisis Center sent a Christmas greeting and thank you for our past support. Canine Companions sent a list of upcoming activities. Other greetings were received from Loaves and Fishes and the Animal Rescue Foundation.

2008 Charities: Bay Area Poodle Rescue (Loretta Mateik) and Contra Costa/Solano Food Bank (Darlene Smith) will be invited to the February meeting to receive a check for \$1,000 each. Jann requested members think about nominating charities for 2009, which will be determined early this year.

Planning Meeting: This meeting was held Sunday, January 18, 2009, at Jann's home. She distributed the Chapter goals developed at that meeting and briefly reviewed them. The minutes from that meeting will be published in the February newsletter. Darlene received an e-mail from SDP announcing the 2009 campaign to recruit new members and bring back former members to the Society. They are asking each member to recruit one new member and to share our passion and knowledge about painting. Also discussed at the meeting were fun things to do such as Tole Trains; i.e. Apple Hill, Gourd Festival, etc. Any

ideas would be welcomed. Jann congratulated Jeanie Gollow on her upcoming marriage. It as noted that the election funds and the balance of the Bunko fundraiser last year will be used for Member Appreciation covering one surface, paint and food at the next Ornament Frenzy.

Jann thanked Loretta Mateik for her work in updating the Chapter website and asked that if anyone had ideas for future seminars to advise the membership and they will be placed on the website. Jann also advised the Chapter is looking for an inexpensive storage locker, in the next month of so, in central County, for storage of Chapter paperwork.

The budget for 2009 was also developed at the Planning meeting and Jann distributed and reviewed the items listed and changes from the prior year. The 2009 budget was approved as presented (Connie Oakley/Darlene Smith).

Announcements: As agreed at a previous meeting, the Chapter library will be liquidated. Jann's husband has offered to transfer appropriate videos to DVDs for us.

2009 Christmas Party: It was unanimously agreed to hold the 2009 Christmas Party at the Holiday Inn in Concord.

Ways and Means: Liz Doran requested members start painting now for Ornament Frenzy submissions and Bunko items. She requested no raw wood for Bunko, as not everyone who participates is a painter.

Seminars: Connie Oakley and Roz Borgerson are co-chairing this committee. Connie reminded members of the upcoming D'Ann Hayes program on January 31 (Santa on a glass jar), Rosemary West's seminar May 14-15, Claudette Garcia's watercolor program on April 25, Deborah Forshey-Chroma's program September 26-27, and Arlene Litton in February, 2010. Jeanie Gollow will be teaching another Maureen McNaughton project at her studio in Windsor on February 21 from 9 to 5 p.m. and the flyer for that program was distributed.

Egg Exchange: The annual egg exchange will be held at the March 17, 2009 meeting.

Hospitality: The sign-up book was circulated.

Guests: The guests present were welcomed: Linda (D.J. West), Carolyn VanLandingham and her mother visiting from Tulsa (Darlene Smith), and Debbie.

Special Drawing: Jo Iaconis made an ornament stand with ornaments and it was won by Jann Otvos. Liz Doran requested items for future special drawings.

Election Workers: Merlene Ryan advised the Contra Costa Election Department notified her of a possible special election sometime in the next four months and asked if we would be willing to work the election. She sent around a

sign-up sheet for anyone interested in participating. She asked that anyone who does work advise them that they are a member of Toll Bridge Toler. She also asked for sign-ups to host memory box painting parties.

Transportation: Merlene also asked that she be advised if anyone needs a ride to Chapter meetings.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:07 p.m. to a Snowman chip clip program taught by D. J. West.
